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## BERKLEY RIVERFRONT



The Berkley Riverfront district is an invitation to outdoor adventure along the Missouri River. It's a key access point to the 15-mile Riverfront Heritage Trail, featuring a wide pedestrian/bike path, sand volleyball courts and plenty of green spaces.

The district is anchored by the history-making CPKC Stadium, the world's first stadium purpose-built for a women's professional sports team. The 11,500-seat venue is home to the Kansas City Current of the National Women's Soccer League.

Lodging and entertainment options have begun emerging at the heart of the district. As the neighborhood grows, more new additions are making it easy to stay and play along the riverfront.



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## RIVER MARKET, CITY MARKET & COLUMBUS PARK

CITY MARKET / RIVER MARKET / RIVER MARKET WEST

International inspiration and undeniable charm are found in the River Market. The neighborhood is beloved for its idyllic weekend mornings and has roots that date back to Kansas City's earliest days.

The City Market is located at the heart of the district and welcomes the area's largest farmers market each weekend. It's a treasured local tradition that welcomes a rotation of producers and vendors from across the region.

Just east of the River Market, the Columbus Park neighborhood is a quaint and quirky residential area with rich Italian and Vietnamese influences.



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## CROSSROADS

KAUFFMAN CENTER / CROSSROADS

At the north end of the area, the soaring Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts is a stunning sight. Inside, the Kansas City Ballet, the Kansas City Symphony and the Lyric Opera of Kansas City dazzle audiences on stage.

Lively encounters with Kansas City's creative community can be found in the Crossroads. At the heart of the area, browse art galleries and local shops of all kinds. Plus, the district comes to life during its monthly First Fridays celebration.

In the East Crossroads, a collection of breweries, distilleries and cocktail bars create one of the city's favorite entertainment destinations. Find streets lined with popular nightlife picks, plus fine dining, live music and more.



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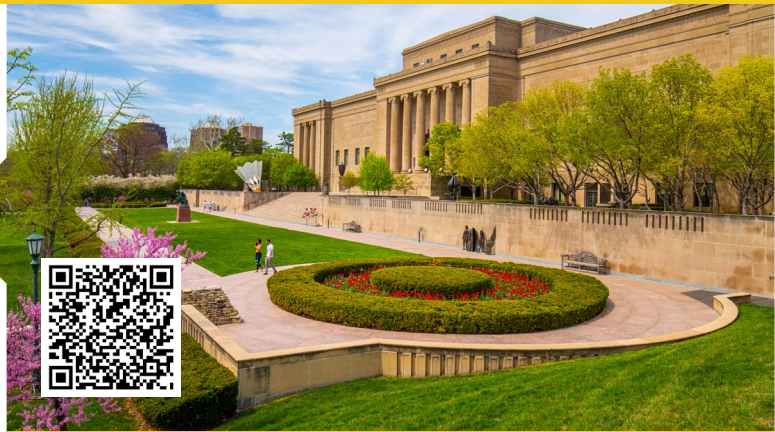
## MIDTOWN & WESTPORT

UNION HILL / ARMOUR / WESTPORT

The sprawling Midtown area is defined by historic beauty and homegrown businesses. Along East 31st Street, the Union Hill neighborhood houses an eclectic array of dive bars, dining, popular patios and local retailers.

Hyde Park is an inviting residential area lined with timeless elegant homes and urban green spaces. Along Broadway Boulevard, the Uptown Theater welcomes top artists from every genre.

Westport originated as a trading post in 1833, then eventually became Kansas City's original entertainment district. Today, it lives on as a popular location for dining, nightlife and holiday celebrations all throughout the year.



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## ART MUSEUMS DISTRICT

SOUTHMORELAND / ART MUSEUMS

The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art boasts free admission and an extensive collection spanning thousands of years. Outside, stroll the 22-acre Donald J. Hall Sculpture Park, where you'll find the city's famous shuttlecocks.

Just next door, the Kemper Museum of Contemporary Art welcomes a regular rotation of modern exhibitions in a sleek and light-filled space. Like its neighbor, admission to the Kemper Museum is free.

The neighborhood is also home to the Kansas City Art Institute and Southmoreland Park, both located between the two museums. It's all connected along a pathway known as The Arterie.



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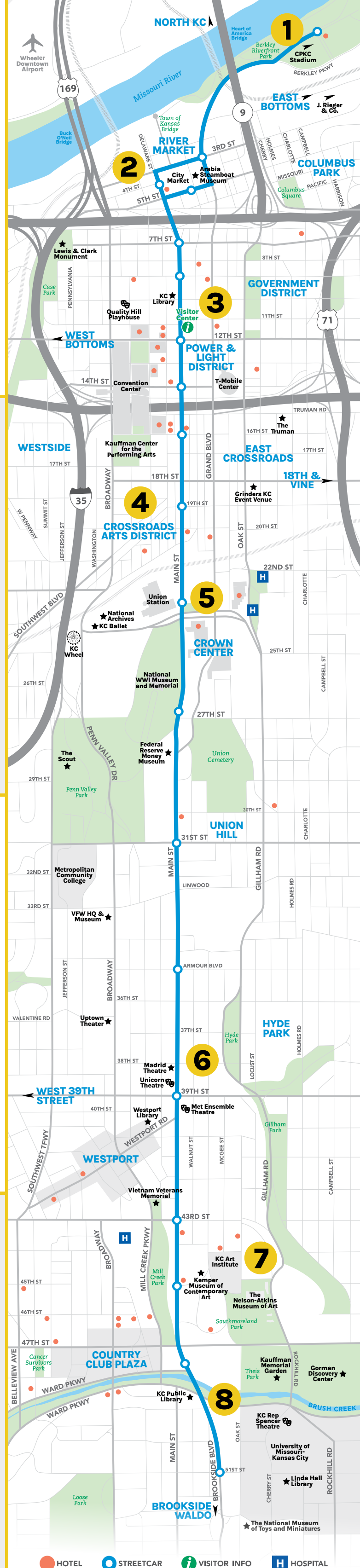
## PLAZA, SOUTH PLAZA & UMKC

PLAZA / UMKC

Opened in 1923, the Country Club Plaza's distinctive Spanish-inspired architecture makes it a standout KC sight. Beneath the towering structures, blocks of national and local shopping choices are joined by some of the city's most iconic fountains.

Beyond Brush Creek, the South Plaza is a charming pick for fan-favorite dining options. It's adjacent to the University of Missouri-Kansas City, a Carnegie Research 1 institution that also fields Division I athletic competition.

Continue for a few blocks down the Trolley Track Trail to browse a vast collection of small-scale handiworks and nostalgic artifacts at the National Museum of Toys and Miniatures.



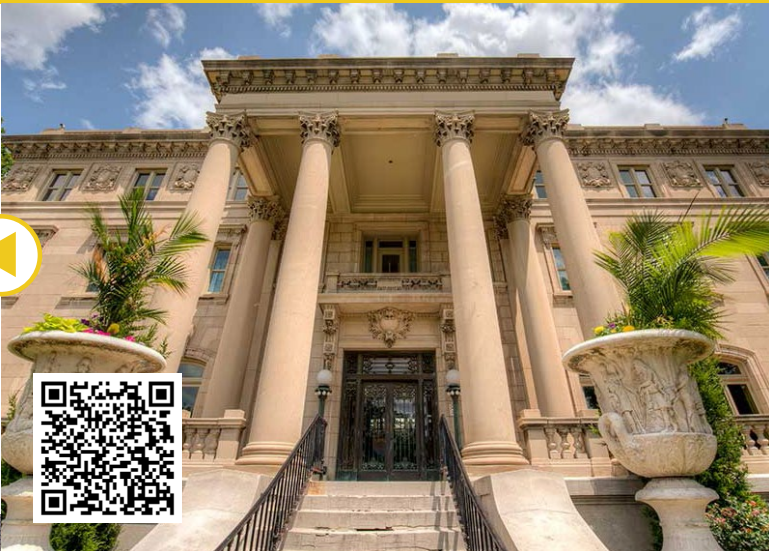


# More Neighborhoods to Explore

## NORTHEAST KANSAS CITY

Filled with stories that have shaped the Heart of America, the free Museum of Kansas City offers a culturally rich exploration of the city across generations. Plus, guests will find timeless touches like an old-school soda fountain.

Nearby, the historic Pendleton Heights neighborhood is dotted with homegrown coffee shops and restaurants. It also houses Cliff Drive, a scenic byway repurposed to prioritize pedestrian and bicycle traffic.



## WESTSIDE

With award-winning restaurants and tucked-away shops found on every corner, the Westside neighborhood is a local favorite. It's shaped by historic and contemporary Hispanic influences.

At the south end of the neighborhood, Southwest Blvd. houses many of Kansas City's favorite Mexican restaurants.



## WEST BOTTOMS

Kansas City's historic stockyards district has become a popular destination for beloved local storefronts, wineries, restaurants and cocktail bars, along with a lineup of seasonal festivals and events.

The neighborhood's towering brick warehouses have been repurposed as retail spaces. On the first weekend of each month, many multistory vintage and antique stores open their doors to shoppers.



## 18TH & VINE

The 18th & Vine Historic Jazz District is home to the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum and American Jazz Museum, two institutions filled with rich insights on art, culture, sports and civil rights in America.

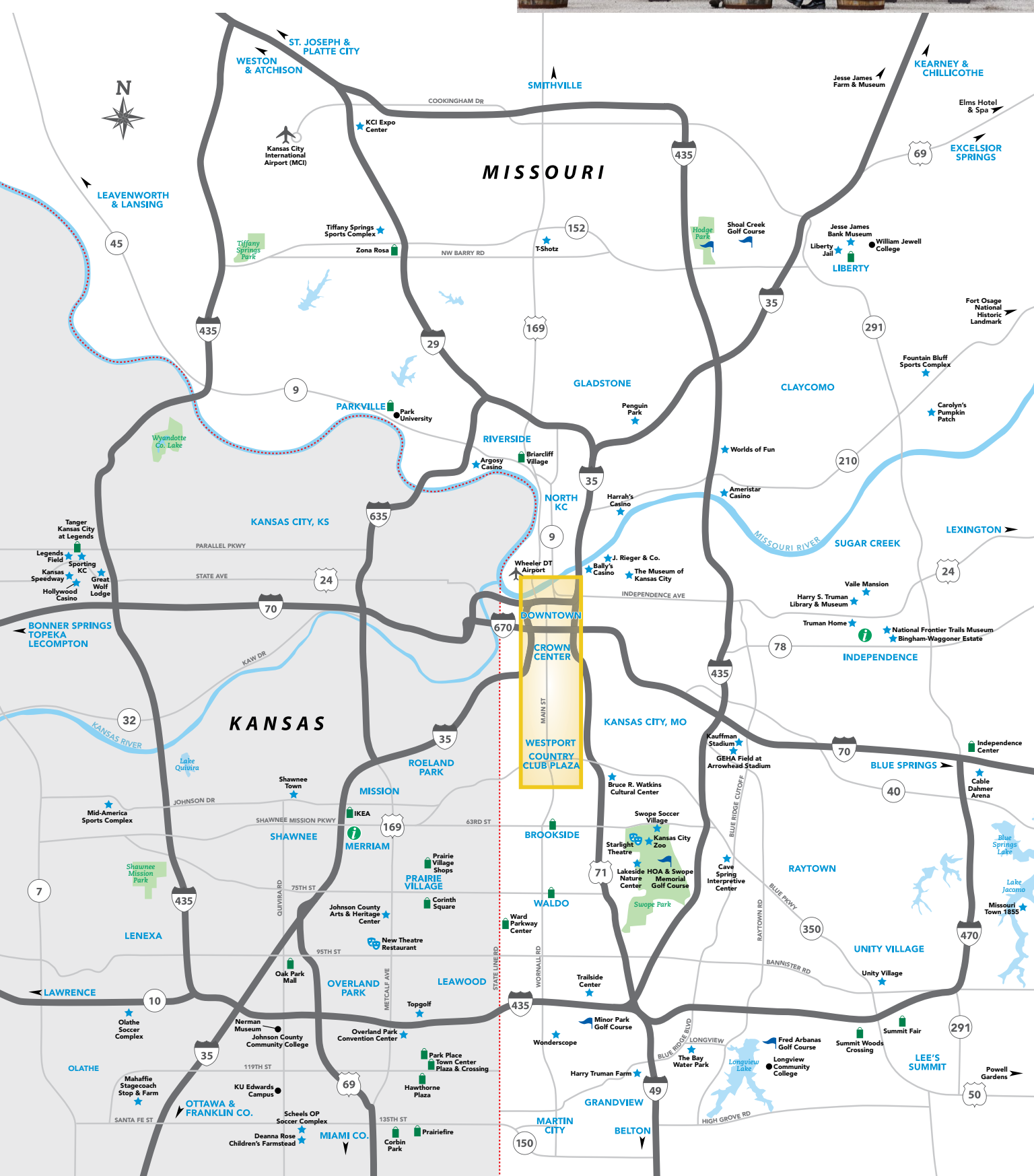
The Black Archives of Mid-America can also be found in the storied neighborhood, along with legendary barbecue and jazz clubs that host late-night performances on a regular basis.



## WEST 39TH STREET

On the western edge of the Midtown/Westport area, West 39th Street is adorned with neon signs and bright colors. It stands proudly as one of Kansas City's most vibrant and eccentric neighborhoods.

The street's treasured dive bars are a defining feature of the area. They're joined by bookstores, dessert shops and restaurants serving cuisines with influences from all around the world.



## BROOKSIDE/WALDO

With whimsical shopping picks tucked beneath a brilliant row of striped awnings, Brookside is one of Kansas City's most picturesque neighborhoods. It's an ideal location to browse local gifts and goods.

Continue south to Waldo, a cozy district treasured for its hole-in-the-wall restaurants and neighborhood sports bars. The pedestrian-friendly Trolley Track Trail connects Brookside and Waldo.
